Widget Use

Adds a styled button that can link to any page on your site or externally. You can add an icon to the button and configure elements such as colour, size and icon position.

Description	A short description of the widget's use.	This description is added to the widget title. It makes the widget's use clear on the template page.	All
Layer	The layer the widget is valid for.	Use layering to limit widget content to certain groups of users. To use the same widget for more than one user group but with different options set, add the widget as many times as needed in the same zone. Then add layering to define the user group each time.	All
Button Label	Text on the button.		All
Button Icon	Icon on the button.	Default: cv-ico-general-arrow-left6 Select via drop-down	All
Icon Position	Icon position relative to the text on the button.	Default: Left	All
Button Colour Type	Styles the button colour in line with site design. Options: Alternate Black Default Primary Secondary	Default: Primary TIP - If you are not sure what your colour selection is, refer to your Style Guides. Link Target	Select from: Blank Current Frame Top Frame Parent Frame	TIP - Blank or Current Frame is typically used. Top Frame and Parent Frame are for advanced users.
